



Call for Papers:

Pratu: Journal of Buddhist and Hindu Art, Architecture and Archaeology of Ancient to Premodern Southeast Asia, inaugural issue, January 2019.

Deadline: 30 June 2018

Pratu is an academic journal for emerging scholars to publish new research on the Buddhist and Hindu visual and material culture of ancient and premodern Southeast Asia. It is funded by the Alphawood Foundation, under the auspices of the Southeast Asian Art Academic Programme (SAAAP). Our publishing remit covers 'study of the built environment, sculpture, painting, illustrated texts, textiles and other tangible or visual representations, along with the written word related to these, and archaeological, museum and cultural heritage'.

The journal is an online space of open access that facilitates new scholars' first experiences with academic publishing as they move from student to early career researcher status. This includes Southeast Asian scholars who would like to reach a wider readership by publishing in English translation and benefitting from the peer-review process.

Pratu is published annually with a mix of feature articles and short reports. Although the working language is English, the journal encourages submissions in Southeast Asian languages and endeavours to provide peer review, translation and editing services for these. Texts in Southeast Asian languages will be published in the original language as well as in English.

Submissions

Original research articles (no more than 7,000 words)

Fieldwork reports (current or recently completed, no more than 2,000 words)

Submission guidelines

- Submissions can be in English or Southeast Asian languages, with accompanying correspondence in English.
- Authors must confirm that the work has not been published elsewhere in any form, nor is currently under consideration for publication elsewhere.
- Texts should be submitted by email to pratujournal@soas.ac.uk in two formats, as a Word document and as a PDF and should include the word

length. All submissions should be labelled 'Pratu article/report submission' in the email subject box.

- If submitting by mail the word length must be included in a covering letter, with full postal and email addresses.
- Texts should be formatted in *Chicago Manual of Style*, Seventeenth Edition.

Open Access

Pratu provides freely accessible content for research, teaching and greater global exchange of knowledge, in keeping with the principle of Open Access at SOAS.
